INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY (21ST JUNE, 2018)

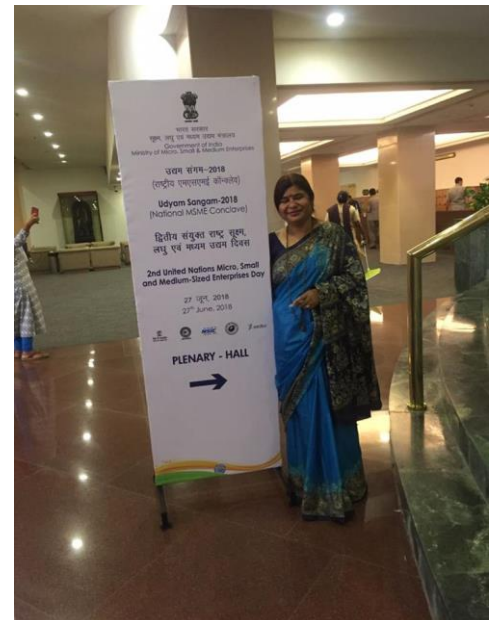

PROJECT GOVIND LEELA

Project Highlights (2016-2018)

The Pyare Foundation established four mini dispensaries and female care units in four remote villages in Uttarakhand during the time span of 2016 to 2018 for the health issues in those remote villages. The demography of four villages in which dispensaries were opened are as follows.

During 2016-2018, four dispensaries along with four female care units were established which makes the total of 8 centers covering approximately 5200-6700 beneficiaries. First three villages from table are the part of Ukhimath block of district Rudraprayag. The Block Ukhimath has 56 Gram Sabhas which include more than 70 Gram Panchayats. The last village i.e. Thapli is located in the block Karnaprayag of district Chamoli.



❖ Expenses under project Govind Leela during 2016-2018

As our first dispensary was established in Hudu village, total expenses in Hudu village dispensary from October 2016 to April, 2018 is almost **Rs 2,00,000**. In general, first three months' expenses of one dispensary is about **Rs 58,000** including transportation, accommodation, inaugural ceremony, medicines and medical equipment, Pharmacists and Asha's remuneration, survey and other miscellaneous charges etc. The remaining expenses of 9 months depends on the requirement of medicines, medical equipment and non-medical equipment at dispensary to improve the infrastructure and activities at premises. The cost of remaining 9th months period may vary however is roughly about **Rs 1,46,000** as per our observation and experience. The total amount that was spent during one financial year on single dispensary is about **Rs 204,083**.

PROJECT GOVIND LEELA (2018-2019)



The project Govind leela has widened its vicinity in the year 2018 by establishing one more dispensary and female care unit in the village Ratura of district Chamoli. Now, the Foundation has reached 10 centers in Uttarakhand for health issues among people of all the age groups and women in particular.

The Ratura village is located in Badrinath Valley and it comes under Chamoli district in block Karnapryag, the population of this village is about 1500-2000 people but again they are not gaining any benefits of the basic facilities such as health, education and employment. Pyare Foundation established its 5th dispensary along with female care unit as a present for this village and its connected villages. About 14 villages are connected with Ratura and the name of those villages are as follows

Ratura dispensary provides health care benefits to all these villages covering about 3500-4000 beneficiaries as of now.

❖ Inauguration ceremony of Ratura dispensary - 24th December, 2018

The Ratura dispensary was inaugurated on 24th December, 2018. It was attended by Secretary Mr. Vinod Raturi along with Dr. Raturi, ADM, Tehsildar, and Patwari. From Team Pyare Foundation Dr. Anjali Thapliyal Kaul President Pyare Foundation along with Secretary Rajesh Kaul, Deputy Secretary Mrs. Pushpa Thapliyal, Operations head Mr. Parvesh Pingolia and Marketing Head Mr. Rohit Kumar attended the ceremony.





Expenses of dispensary

As mentioned earlier that the estimated cost of establishing one dispensary is about Rs 58,000 for first three months and Rs 1,46,000 for next 9 months. For this dispensary also, the estimated amount that was spent while establishing it is Rs 44,050 for the first three months. This is because, the salary of Pharmacist is being taken care by Jan Kalyan Samiti. Jan Kalyan Samiti is a local organization working in that village. The brake up is shown below

WORKSHOP ON FEMALE HEALTH AND HYGIENE (10TH DECEMBER, 2018)

In collaboration with Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti



Workshop Overview

The workshop was designed to discuss and deliberate about female health of the villages and reach consensus for the female health issues and concerns. The aim and objective was to serve females and award female leaders by introducing them to talks and comments of experts, experienced professionals, wise achievers and activists. Many influential personalities were invited in the workshop to highlight major health issues that women face in such areas so that final conclusion could be made on the basis of the discussion. Doctors, Female activists, successful Pradhans & school and college teachers, heads and owners spoke in the venue. The female Pradhans of various wards had face to face interaction and this helped to relate better and retrieve well, the hard lessons in health and hygiene maintenance and sustenance. The meet helped to recognise the input, contribution and trust worthy work of female pradhans in the Rudraprayag district to come out with concrete solutions. The pharmacists and ashas associated with Pyare foundation were tested about their role and action in health pursuits.



The workshop was held on 10th December, 2018 in the block Sabhagar, Ukhimath, Rudraprayag, Uttarakhand in which influential personalities were invited along with female pradhans from 35 Gram Panchayats to highlight the health issues among people and to motivate them in favour to such issues. Dr Sachin Chaubey (Deputy CMO, Ukhimath, Uttarakhand) addressed the issues and suggested us to expand more and to reach more people. He also appreciated our working towards society.

Pradhans from different villages put forward their situation in the society and how some of them fought against the society and stood themselves on their own foot. They shared their stories with other females to motivate them.



Chief Personalities and their suggestions

1. Dr Anjali Thapliyal Kaul - President of Pyare Foundation

I am really thankful to God for providing such an opportunity to serve needy people. We are very delighted to initiate dispensaries and female health care units in 4 villages (Hudu, Gadgu, Gaundar and Thapli) till now. We are fortunate enough as we are getting more proposals from other remote villages as well. We will open such kind of dispensaries in those villages. On 24th December, 2018, we are going to initiate another dispensary in Ratura, near Karnaprayag. You all are cordially invited to be a part of the inauguration ceremony.

2. Upasna Semwal - Awarded with 'Teeru Rohteli' Puraskar

What is women Empowerment? There are plenty of Government schemes that are being run by government for the welfare of people but unfortunately we are not obeying the rules of such schemes properly. Women empowerment is not meant to demean someone but is meant to raise someone, to appreciate someone and to tag along with someone. If we think about our traditional culture, we find that no women harassment exists in our country but with the entry of women empire in our country, the women harassment also commenced. This needs to be ceased and to be worked upon with sincerity. Girl education is also a main concern in our country. Parents do not bother to educate their girl child and hence this mentality of parents must be changed so that each and every girl child would get a fair chance of getting educated. Each and every woman must have women helpline number so that they can use it in case of any emergency. There is a need of awareness in each and every female with the empowerment from inside. Start such a campaign in which honour would be given to the best mother-in-law and best daughter-in-law. This will definitely revolutionise the society.



3. Sunita Vashisht - Principal of Jaqueswin Inter College

Warm greetings to all the participants of this workshop and thank you for inviting me on this stage to speak. There is no need for the women of being dependent on others, every women can manage beautifully and independently. Empower yourselves and take the help of other organisations to educate your girl child. There are number of organisations who are doing great work for the society. A man is nothing without a women as he is born from the womb of a woman. Aware yourself and others.

4. Dr Sachin Chaubey - Deputy CMO, Ukhimath, Rudraprayag, Uttarakhand

There are number of females attached with government health care units such as Ashas, Anganwadis etc. with the help of them, the entire health care unit is being run. Girl education is required in the villages and there is a need to motivate their parents for this act. A program is also being run in schools in which 30 diseases are identified and then a proper treatment is provided to the students for free of cost. Iron folic tablets are being distributed to the children in schools and the awareness of menstrual hygiene is also being provided to the girl children. Government is also distributing sanitary pads and separate toilets are also being constructed for the girl children, however, many students are still left out with these facilities.



Make schools a part of your campaign as there is a need to provide such kind of knowledge to the children. There is a lack of development in children and hence there is a need to distribute iron tablets to them. If we talk about the dispensaries that have been opened by the Pyare Foundation which is no doubt a very good initiative by them, however, there is a need to provide a training to pharmacists of the dispensaries. Take care of the harmful diseases and refer the patients to the higher medical authority in case of any emergency. Prepare list of harmful diseases and keep record of medicines and patients.

5. Sudha Semwal - Poet and Teacher

Raise enough voice that it reaches to the Prime Minister, keep your spirit clean, the environment will automatically be cleaned. I have seen such a stage first time from past 26 years that an organisation is recognising female leaders from the villages. If the female of the house will be empowered, the family will also be empowered. Make such an environment in your home that your daughters do not hide anything from you. Become a friend of your children and resolve their problems. We need to fight together with the female harassment in our society. Women are doing great in all the fields and we need to motivate our children as well.

There are four roles of a woman in any man's life

- a. Mother
- b. Sister
- c. Wife
- d. Daughter

We need to respect all the women for their roles as without them, life is not there. Life without partner is waste and in such cases is a bane and to have equal and long span is must and I pray that partners have better understanding and good fortune to live longer.

6. Chandi Prasad - Poorva Jila Panchayat Adhyaksh

The women empowerment campaigns must be initiated in each and every village for the women. This will make a big change in our society for the betterment of society as their growth will lead to sensible healthier and wealthier communities.



7. Vijay Rana - Nagar Panchayat Adhyaksh

Everyone should be aware of the policies and privileges. Female awareness programs must be initiated for the betterment of females from villages. Give good education to your girl children so that the society is benefited by educated feminine force.



8. Dr Kailash

Keep your hands clean with soap after coming back home from jungles. Drink clean warm water in the morning and properly clean the front and back area from where the passing of urine and stool is done to remain living healthy and hygienically healthy.

Findings and feedbacks

We have got number of findings through the workshop on the basis of discussions of the participants. There are number of findings and feedbacks as follows.

1. There is a need to initiate female campaign in the villages as per the request of most of the guests
2. The need is to make schools, a part of the campaigns where school children need awareness and better understanding of health, hygiene and holistic stage.
3. There is a need to aware female population about their rights and privileges, especially in villages.
4. The aim is to take care of chronic diseases and refer the cases to the higher medical authorities if needed (suggestion given by Dr Sachin Chaubey to Pyare Foundation dispensaries)
5. This is based on expertise and diagnosis ability to train pharmacist with quality training modules and templates through institutes that collaborate with government training programs. This will help to attain efficiency in work.
6. Start campaigns related to sanitary pads and aware female population about the same and distribute the pads if possible.
7. Time to invest in internally created doctor advisory panel and doctor subscription authentication
8. Invest quality time, money and resources in full-fledged dispensary operations and management. No wastage of such means and methods in unresponsive and unsupportive environment.
9. The realisation of corpus fund to create the source for medical assistance, medicinal approachability and service continuity.
10. The leaders should begin with good role and mode showiness for others to follow and become responsible and dutiful. (A paltry, nominal or requisite sum assured should be handed over to trust/society/vo as addressed)

Results and conclusions

The workshop concluded with the great success in which social activists, female leaders, Pradhans, Asha and other villagers took active participation. There was a healthy discussion among all the participants on the issue of health and hygiene in which Dr Sachin Chaubey (Deputy CMO) spoke and shared all the facts on health and hygiene issues. Many leaders also motivated all the female participants in the workshop with the real life examples. The major personalities in the workshop also suggested to implement other campaigns that could help females in some way to secure good future. 17 female and male social activists were awarded with the achiever's award that motivated other population as well. At the end, the workshop was a great success and Pyare Foundation is committed to implement all the suggestions and feedbacks that is provided at the moment in future.

A progress report was submitted at Gandhi Smriti and Darshan Samiti to its Director after the successful completion of the workshop.



PROJECT SHAMBHOO LEELA (24TH DECEMBER, 2018)

Education and Resource center

Introduction

Pyare foundation is also concerned with the education in the remote villages or underprivileged section of the society. The foundation identified the need to uplift the education system in these villages and hence opened their first “education and resource center” under the project “Shambhoo Leela” in one of the remote villages of Uttarakhand as a remarkable attempt towards the change in education system. As of now, the center will serve as a library for the children and the villagers. In future, will will transform this center into the fullyfleged center for children as well as people of the village and the connected villages by providing all the educational resources that will help them to grow, explore, learn and

The need of Education

As we all know that there is a need of education in our country especially in rural areas and backward areas. The people and children in the remote villages are beyond the vicinity of the education and the outer world experiences. Still, there are are villages in which there are no proper facilities for children and the villagers in education point of view. School infrastructure is also lacking with basic amenities and facilities such as toilets, sanitary infrastructure, playgrounds for children, library, recreational centers, resource centers etc. There have been many reforms in the education system in our country since independence however, we have created a gap between the remote areas and the urban areas during that period. Due to this reason, the people are now migrating from villages to urban areas and this practice has lead the bleak villages and the population density is being intensified at limited space in cities and towns. Therefore, proactive measures must be taken by some organisations either individually or in collaboration to slow down the migration rate so that the population density will be equally distributed and villages would also get some basic facilities.

Project Shambhoo Leela

Education is one of the main concern of our country and hence to make India a powerful country we need to invest more on the education as education is the only means through which a person can achieve anything. Children of our country are considered to be the resourceful assets of our country and if we invest more on them, their intellect will grow that will be helpful for the country growth. Hence, Pyare Foundation initiated an education project.

Pyare Foundation introduced the project “Shambhoo Leela” with the goal of promoting education and knowledge in remote villages of the country. This will be carried out by performing various activities, programs and projects with the establishments of library and resource center in the villages. Under this project a library is set up in the villages for public use. This project is meant for all the age groups starting from 5 years till the old age.

This project activity are carried out in three phases such as

1. Survey of the villages - Identifying the need of center in the village
2. Collection of books and necessary stationery
3. Establishment of education and resource center.

First Education and Resource Center



The first “education and resource center” under the project “Shambhoo Leela” was established on 24 December 2018 by Pyare Foundation in Ratura Village, Karnaprayag, Uttarakhand. This education and resource center covers almost 15 nearby villages (4000 - 4500 people). The center was inaugurated by ADM and other

government officials. This education and resource center has many works of literature and academic books for kids and elder villagers.

The team received proposal from Ratneshwar Jan Kalyan Samiti to establish the “Education and Resource Center” in Ratura village. Pyare Foundation team passed the proposal of the “education and resource center” in an official meeting and the stationary along with books of different subjects were collected from the donors. After the collection of all the material, the team proceeded for the inauguration of the Education and resource center in Ratura Village on 24th December, 2018.
